

ACTION ON SUPPLY CHAIN

Population growth, increased demand for food products and climate change are putting our supply chains under increasing pressure. We're committed to sourcing our agricultural ingredients and raw materials sustainably and responsibly.

To make our drinks, we depend on a sustainable supply of high quality agricultural ingredients, including sugar beet and sugarcane, fruit juices, tea and coffee. We also rely on other raw materials such as pulp and paper to make our packaging. We've made a joint commitment with [The Coca-Cola Company](#) to ensure that 100% of our main agricultural ingredients and raw materials are sourced sustainably by 2020.

We also have a duty to respect and protect the human rights of everyone working across our supply chain. We aim to ensure our suppliers respect our Code of Conduct and make a positive impact on society, in line with the [United Nations' Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights](#), the [International Labour Organization's Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work](#) and the [United Nations' Global Compact](#).

We have set out what this means in our [Supplier Guiding Principles \(SGPs\)](#), which apply to all of our suppliers, and our [Sustainable Agriculture Guiding Principles \(SAGPs\)](#), which apply to our suppliers of key agricultural ingredients and raw materials. These are in line with [The Coca-Cola Company's Supplier Guiding Principles](#), and [Sustainable Agriculture Guiding Principles](#). The SGPs and SAGPs have been developed in partnership with industry bodies such as the [Sustainable Agriculture Initiative \(SAI\)](#), and are in line with all internationally recognised standards. These principles apply to all of our suppliers, and we have procedures in place to measure and monitor compliance.

Our Action on Supply Chain supports the [UN Sustainable Development Goal 2](#), by promoting the development of sustainable agriculture, the [UN Sustainable Development Goal 8](#), by seeking to protect labour and human rights, and eradicate forced labour and modern slavery within our supply chain and the [UN Sustainable Development Goal 10](#), reducing inequality within countries.

We'll make sure 100% of our main agricultural ingredients and raw materials come from sustainable sources by 2020.

We'll continue to embed sustainability, ethics and human rights into our supply chain.⁶
